Rather, the details of these reviews show why there may never be strong evidence regarding the effectiveness of individual behavioural measures when deployed, often in combination, in a general population living in the complex, diverse circumstances of individuals' everyday lives. Waiting for strong evidence is a recipe for paralysis. Public health officials must, instead, take measured gambles, based on circumstantial evidence from the reviewed studies and other sources. When protecting the public from harm is the objective, public health officials must act in a precautionary manner to take action even when evidence is uncertain (or not of the highest quality), particularly when the harms and costs of such action are likely limited." - (source)

Introduction

Fenbendazole, often referred to as FenBen, is an anthelminthic medication initially developed to eliminate roundworms and pinworms in animals and humans.

Fenbendazole is a broad spectrum anthelmintic used against gastrointestinal parasites including: giardia, roundworms, hookworms, whipworms, the tapeworm genus Taenia (but not effective against Dipylidium caninum, a common dog tapeworm), pinworms, aelurostrongylus, paragonimiasis, strongyles, and strongyloides that can be administered to sheep, cattle, horses, fish, dogs, cats, rabbits, most reptiles, freshwater shrimp tanks as planaria and hydra treatments, as well as seals.

Common brand names include Pancur, Panacur C and Safe-Guard.

Note: In everyday conversations within the fenbendazole communities, you might encounter Fenbendazole referred to as Phenbendazole, Panacur or SafeGuard. This interchangeability is representative of the common use of the trademarked name; it signifies a consensus within these circles that these terms denote the same medication. Fenbendazole is the active ingredient in all these products. Molecular formula for fenbendazole is C15H13N3O2S.

However, it is also being used by humans in a cancer treatment method known as the Joe Tippens Fenbendazole Protocol.

Although first introduced in 1961, it wasn't until 2009 that FenBen's potential as a cancer treatment was discovered during a glioblastoma (GBM) study at Johns Hopkins University. Since then, numerous case reports have demonstrated FenBen's effectiveness in treating various cancers, including lung, kidney, liver, breast, prostate, melanoma, bone, ovary, colon, and brain tumors.

What is Enhertu?

"Enhertu, generically known as fam-trastuzumab deruxtecan-nxki, is an antibody-drug conjugate (ADC) designed for targeted cancer therapy, particularly for cancers expressing the HER2 protein on their cell surface"

Grok will tell you that it wasn't Enhertu that did this:

"In summary, while there is some indication from patient experiences that Enhertu might lead to reduced CEA levels in some individuals, this is not a guaranteed or direct effect of the drug." That 43% drop in tumor marker CEA was due to the Ivermectin and Mebendazole addition to the treatment regimen.

I share these to show what optimizing Cancer Treatment looks like (especially in Stage 4 Cancer patients). This is cutting edge work not being done at any Cancer Centre in the United States or Canada.


Note: Although technically mebendazole is not the same as fenbendazole, both mebendazole and fenbendazole are part of a larger group of drugs known as benzimidazole, which are anthelmintic drugs (i.e., drugs that kill parasitic worms).

*The class of drugs known as benzimidazoles includes fenbendazole, mebendazole, albendazole and flubendazole

Fenbendazole and mebendazole are similar in that they both eliminate parasitic worms, but there is a difference. Mebendazole is approved for human consumption by the FDA, while fenbendazole is only approved for veterinary use and has not been approved for human use.

Mebendazole is the form that is approved for human use while fenbendazole is approved for veterinary use. The main difference is the cost. Mebendazole is expensive ~\$450 per pill (two pills of mebendazole cost just \$4 in the UK.), while fenbendazole is inexpensive ~48 cents per 222 mg free powder dose (Williams, 2019). Albendazole is the form used to treat intestinal parasites in India and these cost 2 cents per pill.

While most of the pre-clinical research uses mebendazole, probably because it is the FDA-approved-for-humans form of fenbendazole, virtually most of the self-treating clinical reports involve the use of fenbendazole.


- Ivermectin 1mg/kg/day
- Fenbendazole 444mg/day 6 days a week
- Lactoferrin 1000mg/day


Sometimes it's the quality of life improvements you can see right away:

- "Starting to get up and walk around the house" Increased mobilit
- "being able to sleep on her side, which she couldn't do before"

- "she can get up alone from bed and sofa" (improved strenght)
- "blood test results showing good improvements" (improved blood work)

And my favorite:

"Her Oncologist was very surprised to see her well, with lucidity and with enough mobility"





Case 5: July 2024 (Last Update)

I found a breast cancer lump in my left breast in 2016. I stupidly allowed my doctor to biopsy the lesion, which broke the capsule around it. This may have permitted the cancer to spread to the nodes, making me Stage 2 with three positive lymph nodes. The doctors had said the lump was too big to do a lumpectomy. I should have done cryotherapy to treat the nodule but chose instead to have a bilateral mastectomy with reconstruction in one procedure to avoid repeated MRIs and constant worry. After surgery, they recommended tamoxifen, chemo, and radiation. I refused it all and was treated with diet, DIM supplements, vitamin D, stress reduction, psychological counseling, and spiritual work.

In early 2022, I began to have a cough and shortness of breath. My chest x-ray showed a large right pleural effusion (fluid around my lung), and when it was sampled using a needle, it contained malignant breast cancer cells. My scans showed mediastinal lymph nodes (in the chest's center), a nodule in the right upper lung lobe, and a lymph node in each armpit.

To breathe, I was forced for a time to have the fluid around my lungs extracted with a needle every two weeks. This was despite using hyperbaric oxygen therapy, a detox supplement regimen, and other treatments, including green tea, vitamin C infusions, ozone therapy, high-

dose melatonin, green tea capsules, ketogenic diet, infrared sauna, and quantum biofeedback. Quantum biofeedback is an advanced system. It is different from other biofeedback that works on arousal states. Instead, it works on frequencies using a complex computer algorithm program that can be used diagnostically and therapeutically. I also began daily ivermectin (IVM) and beta-carotene supplements.

Within four months of starting IVM, the fluid stopped forming around my lungs. My PET scan six months after beginning ivermectin showed no active cancer in any fluid, no nodule in the lung, and just a couple of lymph nodes that were below the active cancer metabolic threshold.

I then (stupidly) tapered the ivermectin dose to 30 mg twice a week. I was taking so many supplements and foods that I could not tell what was working. The pleural effusion recurred about three to four months after reducing the ivermectin. It was in my left lung this time, and the mediastinal lymph nodes reappeared. I had missed the importance of ivermectin in my overall treatment plan.

In August 2023, I visited the Hope 4 cancer clinic in Cancun, but it was an expensive disaster that did nothing to help me. I again started requiring weekly pleural taps and eventually needed a Pleurex catheter to drain the fluid daily. My left lung was my only normal lung after damage to my right lung in 2022 from the constant fluid and subsequent lung collapse.


From September 2023 until July 2024, I took 120mg of IVM daily plus fenbendazole 444mg daily. Six months later, fluid stopped forming around my left lung. However, I started developing teeth staining, and after about five months, my blood enzymes showed liver dysfunction. After a 10-day break from both medications and restarting them at lower doses, I felt better. My PET/CT scans in March 2024 and July 2024 showed no cancer metabolic activity and no evidence of cancer or lymph nodes anywhere, and my follow-up scans are planned for October 2024. I now take 45mg of ivermectin five days a week, none on the weekend, and fenbendazole 440 mg twice a week.


Case 4: September 2024 (Last Update)

Case 1: December, 2022

Condition: Stage 4 ER+PR+HER2- Metastatic Breast Cancer to bones

A friend told me about the Joe Tippens Protocol and ivermectin the day after I got my diagnosis for a third bout with breast cancer. I started both immediately. I saw my oncologist a week later. She added Faslodex, Kisgali, and Femara. She supported me added the JTP and the ivermectin. In 8 weeks I was in remission as measured by my CA2729. At week 11, a PET scan showed NED.

Which of the protocol components did you use? Fenbendazole, Curcumin, CBD/ cannabis Oil, Berberine, Other

Other supplements used: 12 mg ivermectin daily

Which conventional treatments did you do? Hormone therapy

Case 2: March, 2022

In 2018, I experienced heavy fatigue most of the time. It almost felt as if I got weaker and weaker as the days went by. I felt this lump on the side of my breast and got it checked out right away. I received the news that I have stage 4 metastatic breast cancer Mets to lymph nodes, liver and bone In my upper shoulder.

Case 3: June, 2021

Three years ago I received a lumpectomy, which is when the cancer gets removed from a part of the breast tissue. The surgery was successful and I was declared free of any cancer back then, till about two years later I was diagnosed with stage 4 breast cancer with Mets to lymph nodes, bones, and bone marrow. It basically spread all over my body. This was terrifying at the time and I felt there was no way to win this battle.

With no options left, I decided to go onto the Joe Tippens protocol, and followed it for a whole good year before I received my PET scan results stating that I am cancer free! And to make this even more insane to think of – I wasn't receiving any form of chemo or radiation ever during the recovery process, the only medication I consumed alongside following this protocol was hormone blockers.

I however got very sick in the beginning stages of using this protocol and started using Serrapeptase (an enzyme) along with it, which seems to have taken all side effects away. I gained my strength back and my blood tests were normalized on every account. After being only 6 months on the protocol more than half of my cancer disappeared. Here is a brief idea of what my protocol looked like:

- Serrapeptase (as I wake up)
- Fenben, Vit D and Vit K, Quercetin with Zinc (at noon)
- Turkey tail mushrooms & Letrozole (also at noon)
- RSO (before bedtime, but a very little amount)

I only removed refined sugars and corn syrup from my daily diet and other than that, I just continued with my activities of daily living. This combination of supplements along with the fenben really did the magic and I will continue to follow this lifestyle to prevent any evidence of disease to show up!

PROTOCOL: MRI brain without and with 20 mL Dotarem intravenous contrast.

FINDINGS:

Brain parenchyma:

No restricted diffusion suggestive of new acute infarct. Redemonstration of cystic and solid mass throughout the right temporal lobe and extending slightly within the periventricular right parietal lobe to abut the occipital horn and temporal horns of the right lateral ventricle. Associated edema throughout the right temporal lobe and parietal lobe is more extensive along the posterior aspect (series 6, image 14-21) to involve the U fibers. Extension along the splenium is slightly decreased since prior exam. Minimal increase along the thalamus. Associated restricted diffusion involving the right temporal lobe mass is slightly less conspicuous in the peripheral enhancing components when compared to prior exam. Previously seen faint increased diffusion signal in the ependymal regions and along the genu no longer appreciated. When evaluating enhancement on spin-echo imaging, favor slight decrease in thickness of the peripheral enhancement in the inferior component of the mass when compared to prior exam (for example series 10, image 11 when compared to prior exam series 11, image 13/series 10, image 10 when compared to prior exam series 11, image 12). Although difficult to measure size of the mass given distribution, favor slight decrease in size of the central

cystic component. Mass effect on the right lateral ventricle appears decreased superiorly when compared to prior exam. Difficult to evaluate the anterior right temporal horn versus cystic component of the mass which appears increased (series 5, image 13 when compared to series 5, image 15). Inferior mass effect on the third ventricle is improved. Leftward midline shift is not appreciated at the level of the septum pellucidum (previously measured 4 mm). Minimal leftward midline shift at the level of the third ventricle is improved. There is decrease in parenchymal enhancement of the lateral ventricles when compared to prior exam with persistent linear enhancement involving the frontal horns. New additional enhancement is not appreciated. The previously seen edema in the mesial temporal lobe is slightly improved. The left lateral ventricle and third ventricle appear

In November 2023, she had started Fenbendazole 444mg (Panacur) and Melatonin 100mg


In August 2024 we added 150mg of Ivermectin or 2.5m/kg/day, and CBD-THC Oil.


You heard that right. Ivermectin 2.5mg/kg/day.


And then...

4. Bladder Cancer and Fenbendazole Success Stories

Case 1: February, 2023 (updated)

NOW must continue to follow this path and make the changes to keep cancer free and use Fenbenzadole as I must. Thank you and never give up !!!

I was offered palliative chemotherapy for end of life pain management, but decided to start taking a number of alternative methods alongside the palliative chemotherapy and continued to take until I finally reached remission.

What I took to get to remission after palliative chemo was all on offer (palliative chemo finished on the 25th March 2019).

Scott Davis protocol -

- − 2000 mg cbd oil 4 capsules (18-20 drops) x a day
- THC oil 4 capsules (18-20 drops) x a day (feco 1:1 mct) 65-75% thc. \checkmark I do this at 08:00-12:00 16:00 20:00
- Milk thistle twice a day. (2000mg)
- Vitamin d3 twice a day. (4000iu)
 Curcumin twice a day. (4000mg)
- Vitamin c once a day. (1000mg)
- Vitamin b12 once a day
- Cod liver oil.
- Vitamin e once a day 💊
- Berbine. (1000mg) x 2
- B17 apricot seeds. (22 mg) x 4 🂊 Aspirin (1/2) a day 💊

I reduced my sugar and dairy intake as much as possible and tried to eat a healthy plant based diet with the occasional bit of chicken or turkey. I also drink 5 cups of green tea a day and added berbine (1000mg x 2 a day) and added turkey tail mushrooms and lions mane mushrooms.

After remaining stable and contained from January 2019 for over 12 months I finally got the PET scan results I'd dreamed of. "no active cancer". (February 2020.) CT scan in August 2020 continued to show improvement and only shows scare tissue where the inoperable Tumour once was.

Hi everybody. I just wanted to share my story with you. On June 11, 2021 I was diagnosed with stage 4 colon cancer with multiple Mets to the liver ... I am labeled, "incurable ". F18-FDG PET-CT SCAN

Metastatic colorectal adenocarcinoma. Assessment of disease.

Patient consultation. PET and non-diagnostic AC AL CT were acquired from skull vertex to knees 60 minutes after I.V administration of 186MBq F-18 FDG. BSL was 4.9mmol/L. Diagnostic contrast enhanced CT HCAP.

Findings

Comparison with 15/03/2022

There is no significant residual abnormal FDG uptake above physiological background in the previously seen intensely FDG avid inflitrative metastatic disease throughout the left occipital condyle, clivus and basiocciput. The left neck lymph nodes have resolved. No intracranial mass. Grey-white matter differentiation and cerebral contrast enhancement is normal.

The left thoracic inlet lymph node has resolved. The posterior mediastinal and retrocrural lymph nodes have resolved. Lungs are clear. No effusion.

The abdominopolvic nodal disease has also resolved, (less than 4 mm in short axis on CT and non-avid). No new lymphadenopathy. The sigmoid the tumour shows residual mild wall thickening on CT and mild FDG uptake, significantly regressed from the previous intense FDG uptake. No evidence of liver metastasis noting several simple cysts which are unchanged. Background diffuse liver steatosis is also noted. There is no omentoperitoneal disease evident. The other abdominal viscera are " Authorized by Dr Dalveer Singh

satisfactory. No free fluid.

Musculoskeletal

Diffuse reactive marrow uptake is noted.

The metastatic nodal and skull base disease shows a complete metabolic response to therapy when compared to 15/03/2022. A near-complete metabolic response to the sigmoid primary tumour, now showing only mild wall thickening on CT and low level uptake. No new metastasis.






According to Dr William Makis (source):

Patient: 93 year old man with esophageal cancer (distal esophagus), sent home on hospice to die. Her dad took 3ml (300mg) of Safeguard (Merck) Fenbendazole once a day, 3 days on 4 days off, from July 30, 2023 until Oct. 10, 2023 when he was declared cancer free on follow-up scans. 

In this case, we see two tumors with a 25% drop in metabolic activity in 2 months.

On a CT scan, the lesions would look stable but metabolic information tells us 25% of the tumor has been killed off. It takes a bit longer for the body to start clearing the dead cancer cells. Once again, this patient had no chemo, no immunotherapy, no radiation, no conventional Oncology treatment of any kind. Only Ivermectin and Fenbendazole, both well tolerated.



11. Kidney Cancer Case Series (7 cases)

Case 1,2 and 3: Three patients with different primary kidney related tumors demonstrated complete response (CR) after receiving FenBendaZole (FBZ) therapy.

Despite multiple anecdotal stories and news outlet reports for its efficacy in treating metastatic cancer, the clinical literature behind utilizing FBZ (fenbendazole) as a potential antineoplastic agent remains nonexistent. Existing scientific studies have primarily studied its mechanism of action through the use of animal models. In a study published in Clin Oncol Case Rep (2020), researchers from Stanford describe three cases where patients achieved **complete responses**, including two who experienced progression after multiple lines of therapy, when FBZ was used alone or in combination with standard therapies.

In summary, three patients with different primary genitourinary tumors who demonstrated complete response after receiving FBZ therapy. This raises the question of how effective FBZ can be as an anti-oncogenic agent and merits further investigation.

According to the authors:

Prior studies have demonstrated cancer response to immune checkpoint inhibitors such as nivolumab as a third-line agent in mRCC (metastatic renal cell carcinoma). The duration of therapy was often much longer requiring a median therapy duration of 6 months with 24% overall response rate in third-line treatment. It is possible that our first patient with mRCC would have achieved a significant response to nivolumab alone without FBZ. However, given the complete radiologic response on only 1 month of immune checkpoint inhibitor therapy, it also seems likely that FBZ played a notable role in inducing remission. This is supported by the fact that our patient has remained in extended remission while only on FBZ for nearly a year without further administration of immune checkpoint inhibitor therapy.

Surgery 8/2/21 left radical nephrectomy with complications and have colostomy

9/2/21 Start Opdivo

11/2021 Start Yervoy in addition to Opdivo (and FenBen)

11/2021 (just before Thanksgiving), doctor said "let's see if you can make it 5 weeks" when husband asked about prognosis

12/21 Travel to NYC to spend what my husband believes is his last Christmas

1/3/21 ER visit due to lack of lucidity

1/22 Start Cabo (have been off FenBen because of all the hospital visits)

2/4/22 see medical consultant – start FenBen again

5/22 – Cancer is shrinking some totally gone – off nearly all pain meds. Doctor says he's never seen this much progress in such little time.

6/22 – Cancer is still shrinking – off almost every pain med (1 10MG Oxy a day)

7/22 - Cancer still shrinking!! PTL

Not doing anything crazy

Case 5: November, 2021

In the beginning of 2021 I was diagnosed with stage three kidney cancer followed by stomach cancer a few months after.

I did not want to go for any radiation or chemo knowing the adverse effects it will have on my body. I jumped onto a fenbendazole course immediately which I followed for a good 6 months and got the incredible news that I am completely cancer free!


I declined any medical help that came my way and decided with dedication and faith to take the natural path to healing from the very beginning of my cancer journey.

I started off on a dose of 150mg and kept on increasing it from there over a period of four months. In July of 2018, my husband received his first cancer diagnosis. Stage 2 Adenocarcinoma in his upper right lung lobe. Mutations tested. Lobe was removed

July 23, 2018, and he was put on active surveillance, no treatment.

On 11/14/2018, he received his second diagnosis, prostate cancer, adenocarcinoma with metastasis, stage 4, and Gleason score 9. Prostate was removed, followed by 7 weeks of radiation, and put on ADT therapy (Lupron and Xtandi), no chemo. Mutations tested, not favorable, and very aggressive. He is a rare case where cancer didn't show in blood or any scans. To this day, it still doesn't. We can only monitor by symptoms.

He started to progress in symptoms in June of 2022. August of 2022, diagnosed with a 2nd lung cancer, stage 4 adenocarcinoma. Mutation testing repeated, this time, it showed similar

mutations as 1st lung cancer, but also some slightly different ones that led them to believe it was a different cancer.

He began treatment on 01/09/2023. We were not given any hope, and they said mutations were not in his favor and that treatment was highly unlikely to do anything, but they offered it anyways saying it would buy him time. They made it very clear he did not have the mutations they were hoping to see, they were hoping it was a mutation that responds favorably to treatment, and he didnt have those.

It didn't make sense, in 1 sentence they stated it wasn't likely to work, but yet it could buy him time?? It is his journey, and he decided to try. 2 chemo drugs, and I immunotherapy for 4 treatments spaced 3 weeks apart. Then they dropped 1 chemo and said he would stay on double treatment for up to 2 years, then they would drop to just immunotherapy. He stayed on double for 7 treatments. But his body was worn out. They decided 1 more treatment, and if scans looked good, they would drop the other chemo. But he got sick just before the last double treatment was supposed to happen. It has delayed his scan as well. But it is a viral thing, not cancer related, as far as we know.

Let's get to the good stuff though... People started sending me messages, LOTS of people, asking me if I'd heard of the Fenben Protocol. I started getting these messages in August of 2022, right after his biopsy confirmed a new occurrence. To be honest, I ignored the messages until I got 2 in 1 day in November. I decided ok, I'm going to check this out. I joined the group on December 16th, 2022 and I started tearing into the files. And I started researching, and research led me to a medical sight that leaned very favorably in Fenbens direction. We discussed as to whether to bring it up to oncology, but they had made it clear in the beginning that if we choose to do natural, they would not treat him, so we kept our mouths shut.

He started the protocol at the end of February. His scans on 12/22 and 02/23 showed new masses had grown since the scan in July of 22. But by the next scan on 04/06/2023 many of the masses were still present, but stopped growing. But the masses in his pleura (which is what deemed him terminal) were almost gone! I have stage 4 Adenocarcinoma of the lungs...doctor told me it's not curable. I'm 44 with two teenagers so I don't want to hear that kind of news. Anyway, I was diagnosed in December and by January I received chemotherapy. A friend told me about Fenbendazole and I started it immediately. I am now on chemotherapy, immunotherapy, and Fenbendazole. After 4 treatments...I had a PET Scan....the scan was remarkable. Many subcentimeters nodules resolved, the two large masses are shrinking, no enlarged lymph nodes in the hilar and mediastinal region. No new growth! I'm hoping this is a good sign.

*Using Fenbendazole 220mg day and night, chemo taxol/Carbo, and Keytruda since January.

Case 3: March, 2022

In 2020, I was diagnosed with stage 4 lung carcinoma. The Oncologist found a big tumor growing on my left lung along with a massive tumor inside my chest cavity so big that it started constricting my heart arteries.

They started me with radiation right away followed by weeks of intensive chemotherapy, and I got so sick that they had to lower the doses and frequency to half of what they originally had me on.

- Drank green tea often

- Curcumin (600mg tablet per day are recommended
- Berberine (600mg 2-3 times a day)
- Quercetin (500mg 1/day)
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- Vitamin E (800mg for 7 days a week)
- Fenbendazole (1000mg at night)
- Ivermectin 12mg daily 5/7days a week
- Limit sugar and processed food intake
- Drank green tea often"

Case 2: March, 2023

My family member was diagnosed in stage 4 pancreatic cancer in August 2022. She was told it was very aggressive and without treatment she had 3-6 months and to get her affairs in order. She started 220 fenben immediately. She was very ill and hospitalized with sepsis and colitis from eating tainted peanut butter. She lost about 20 pounds. It took 2 months to start chemo, which made her very sick. We almost gave up because her quality of life had declined significantly. But she started feeling better. Less nausea. 19. Prostate Cancer

Case 9: December 2024



Pretty standard stuff from a famous large US Cancer Centre that is stuck in the "Big Pharma quidelines" era with zero creative thought.


Patient did about a month of Fenbendazole 222mg Joe Tippens Protocol, then I got involved.


In 12 days PSA drops 1533 to 968 (37% drop). Abdominal cancer lymph nodes disappeared.



Additional benefit with a ketogenic diet! Now this is only 3 months in, but I think PSA 800 to 18 is good progress so far.



Still no comment from any doctor and I'm not expecting any.

Case 3: September, 2022

My husband was diagnosed 8 months ago.. Feb 1st of this year,, with a aggressive form of prostate cancer that had already metastasized into his lymph nodes and bones. He had fractures throughout his spine, ribs and pelvis. Adams bone scan showed cancer in his bones from his skull,, facial bones, clavicle, sternum right rib cage and most of his spine and pelvis.. His oncologist (we've since changed) waited 7 weeks to start any hormone therapy or chemotherapy and told us radiation wasn't even an option. Only 6 rounds of doxi. He sat at our first office visit Feb 2nd and told my family that the #1 man in our lives would be gone within 18 months. His psa was 140, Gleason score of 9. He was diagnosed full blown stage 4-5 cancer. This was completely unacceptable. Absolutely devastating to our world. My husband is 55 yrs old.. We have 8 children and 8 grandchildren. Our last 2 kids had just moved out a year before.. this was our time.. We had always talked about IF cancer ever came about for either of us we would research alternative treatments. We fear medical poison as much as the cancer itself..

Thank God my husband's cousin connected us with a angel that gave us all the information we needed on a product meant for animals, fenbendazole and even sent us 2 bottles of fenbendazole. Has since supplied us with bottles when needed.

So week 2 post diagnosis Adam started his 222mg of fenben.

Case 2: March, 2022

I received the awful news two years ago from my Urologist that I have prostate cancer. The doctor wanted to prepare me for surgery immediately, but I refused to go for surgery. I was very afraid and gave up hope at some point till I discovered the fenbendazole protocol. Thanks to reaching out to a couple of people who have been on the course before and after sharing their stories with me I decided to take the protocol on with full commitment.

Case 1: June, 2022

20. Sarcoma

Case 2: IVERMECTIN & FENBENDAZOLE for Stage 4 Spindle Cell Sarcoma

Palliative chemo (was not expected to help and it's all the doctors had left to offer)

My Take...

Spindle Cell Sarcoma is a cancer that's notoriously difficult to treat.


The response rate of chemo is on the order of 20% (which means 80% of patients don't see ANY improvement). The ones who respond see minimal results.

To get tumor shrinkage by 60% and disappearance of multiple lesions is stunning. The chemo was palliative and was not expected to help in this case.

So yes, it wasn't the chemo. Sorry.

And these were VERY LOW doses of Ivermectin & Fenbendazole!!

I tend to suggest higher doses as cancer killing with Ivermectin & Fenbendazole is dose dependent.



The response rate to chemotherapy for soft tissue sarcoma, including spindle cell sarcoma, varies by study and treatment:

- Doxorubicin: The response rate for doxorubicin monotherapy is around 20%.
- Doxorubicin and ifosfamide: The objective response rate for doxorubicin and ifosfamide is around 20–30%.
- Doxorubicin and trabectedin: When combined, doxorubicin and trabectedin can shrink tumors enough to allow for surgical removal in 20% of patients.
- Talimogene laherparepvec and pembrolizumab: In a phase 2 trial, the best overall objective response rate was 35%.

Case 1: September, 2023

Condition: Alveolar Rhabdomyosarcoma

When my 13 year old son was diagnosed, I basically became a cancer researcher!

I discovered a few new very promising treatments that are close to being ready for pediatric use, and I also came across Joe Tippen's story. I joined a couple of large, international Facebook groups related to the Protocol, which are by far the most positive of all of the cancer-related groups I'm in, and have the most success stories. I connected with a mom in the group whose 2 year old has the same type of cancer as my son, which had spread to his lymph nodes during frontline chemotherapy treatment. She started him on Fenben and his next 2 scans so far have been clear!

21. Skin Cancer

Case 5: Basal Cell Carcinoma (BCC)

In this December 2024 case report published by Canadian Oncologist Dr. William Makis, we note the pictorial resolution of basal cell cancer [BCC] to the point that the patient may have to cancel his appointment for a planned surgical removal. One cannot surgically remove a basal cell cancer [BCC] that no longer exists.

This gentleman reports he is a long-time reader of Dr. Makis and was particularly interested in his reports of Fenbendazole and Ivermectin. He contracted basal cell cancer on his face in February or March of 2024, and did what most of us would do - he booked an appointment with his GP in June 2024, apparently the first available.

The soonest he could get scheduled for the Dermatology referral was sometime in November. Having nothing to lose, he decided to apply Fenbendazole paste per the articles he had

previously read, and to his pleasant surprise the persistent non-healing skin cancer of seven months began to shrink in size.



FenBen Treatment from September 25 through October 28, 2024

By the time of his November Dermatology appointment, there was very little to biopsy, yet it was done. He reports the Dermatologist was not the least bit interested in his tumor shrinkage with the Fenbendazole paste. Instead, the Dermatologist booked him for a tumor removal appointment three months later in February 2025.

The patient continued to apply the paste for the next month following the November biopsy, and here is what the BCC looked like as of December 6, 2024.

I'm booked for early Feb to have it removed. It took a couple of weeks for the scab to fall off after the biopsy, and this is how it looks now:



Result of FenBen Topical Treatment from September 25 through December 6, 2024

He writes,

"I'm still treating it once a day with Safeguard 10% Fenbendazole and it seems to still be improving. So I'm undecided about whether I need to have anything removed. I guess I'll see how it goes over the next while. Maybe it's deep into the tissue despite having improved the surface cells. No idea."


Dr. Makis writes in response that patients who take matters into their own hands seem to do better.

Case 4: Melanoma (Skin Cancer)

Shared by Dr William Makis (X/Twitter) - Last Edited: October 2024:

There were still signs of lymph nodes increasing or being classified as unknown results. I continued the use of the fenben protocol along with a whole bunch of other supplements to take on a daily basis, as within 5 months results improved in comparison to a whole year of fighting off the protocol before with little to non improvement in results. I strongly believe in this protocol and in case you wondered – I am not on any chemotherapy/radiation/immunotherapy or any other western medicine use – this is a full on natural and holistic journey I went on, and I am happy to share my current protocol with all cancer patients out there:

- Serrapeptase (at midnight)
- Vit D & K2, Tudca 500mg, Graviola 1ml (on an empty stomach)

- Varies supplementation with breakfast (like Vit C & B complex, probiotics, fish oil, curcumin, etc. along with fenben 888mg)
- Multi-vitamin, turkey tail extract, fenben 888mg, and B17 apricot seed (with dinner)
- Some more other supplements just before bed (like magnesium, Vit C, Graviola, high dose of melatonin, coffee enemas, etc)
- Detox baths (1 x week)
- Frequency music (before bed designed to kill cancer cells)
- Mainly following a plant-based diet
- Protein intake is limited to certain meats
- Fresh whole foods/vegetables
- Healthy fats only

I trust that this protocol I am following will guide a lot of people out of their state – just belief and trust the process along with the support from others who have been through this before. Good luck.

Case 2: October, 2022

In February and March of this year I was diagnosed with stage four melanoma. It had metastasized to my brain, lymph nodes, right lung, adrenal gland and right hip. My daughter pointed me to Joe's story and this site. I started taking the fenbendazole protocol even before my oncologist gave me her treatment plan using Immuno therapy. The oncologist said that it had about a 30% success rate but not to expect any great results on the first scan after 4 treatments.

I had a PET scan last week and the results were almost too good to be true. Cancer basically gone. The tumor in my right lung had shrunk to less than half the size it was on the first PET scan. The uptake on that tumor decreased from 19.9 to 2.6. I was told by her that an uptake of less than 4.0 is no longer considered as cancerous.

I have been on the fenbendazole protocol for 166 days now. I received 4 immunotherapy injections using 2 different drugs. I can't say for sure what definitively gave me these great results. Draw your own conclusions but I think the fenbendazole was largely responsible for the great results.

Case 1: January, 2022

At first me and my partner were unsure about trying alternative treatments in addition to the radiation my partner receives. With the help from a holistic healer and referrals from a couple of people in our community, we found out about the fenbendazole protocol and started to add the protocol along with a few other supplements to my partner's daily intake/routine to aid in

fighting the skin cancer on his neck.

22. Throat Cancer

December, 2021

I never knew that the day would surface for me to find out that I got diagnosed with cancer. My life turned upside down in seconds that day and ever since I have been doing research upon research – reading and gathering all the information I could get on the prognosis of my cancer and the treatments that are out there to help fight what is called HPV Squamous Cell Carcinoma (throat cancer). I ended up taking fenbendazole (dose of 2000mg) after a consultation with a holistic doctor who examined it with added supplements to the fenben protocol the doctor has put me on.

23. Thymus cancer

October, 2022

Condition: Thymus cancer

Was diagnosed with Thymic Carcinoma 06/2022. Just finished week 8 of 12 week chemotherapy. I have been taking fenbendazole, curcumin, vit D & K, and CBD oil. We will do another PET scan in October and I fully expect the tumors to be completely gone or greatly reduced. Will update with the results asap. Blessings to all.

24. Tongue Cancer

IVERMECTIN & FENBENDAZOLE & Topical Ivermectin Testimonial - 70s year old US patient with Squamous Cell Carcinoma of Tongue seeing improvement - mainstream doctors coming on board!

I have a 70s year old US patient with a bad case of tongue cancer (squamous cell carcinoma)

Mainstream Oncology has offered to resect her tongue.

26. Uterine cancer

May, 2023

My 81 yo mother, Virginia, found out she had recurrent Endometrial Uterine Cancer back in

Sept 2022. Stage 4 and Mets to abdominal area, lymph nodes, chest cavity and lungs. Radiation was not an option and she opted out of chemo, which would have only bought her a few extra months but would have made her very sick and weak. The doctor put her on a Hormone Blocker to keep it from growing any more. (But if in the lymph nodes, does it really stop it??) The Dr. sent her home to be under Hospice care for the remainder of her short time left on this earth.

I was not ready to accept this!! (Plus, my father has dementia and desperately needs her!) I prayed to God to give us wisdom and guidance. Within 24 hrs., three people approached me about the Joe Tippen Protocol, which I had never heard of at that time. I figured I might ought to listen so I googled and got sucked in! The tumors are either gone or have shrunk considerably!!!! (All but ONE, which basically has stayed the same). All of the ascites (malignant fluid all in her Ab area) was GONE!! The Doctor patted himself on the back but WE PRAISE GOD AND FENBEN!!!

We take one day at a time and hope and pray for the best for years to come but, for today, things are going well!!! (Other than her weakness)

Condition: Endometrial carcinoma

In May 2021 I was diagnosed with stage IV endometrial carcinoma. I went through 6 months of hard chemo and 12 months of Maintenance chemo. March 2022 I started fenbendazole working up to 2000 mg a day, along with other supplements. I had a consult this month with Zahara, and she recommended tweaking a few things and adding a few more supplements. I worked hard on my mindset and made sure I surrounded myself with positivity. I received the best news today I could hope for. No evidence of active disease. Never give up!

- Cancer care is a team effort with the patient at the centre. Care should be supervised
 and coordinated by a primary healthcare provider. Patients with cancer should consult
 with their regular oncologist as well as an integrative provider/oncologist, in addition to
 their primary care provider and the supporting nurses, dieticians and other allied
 healthcare professionals.
- While the term 'alternative' might imply opposition to conventional oncology, we prefer 'complementary,' 'integrated,' or 'holistic.' These terms better reflect the role of these strategies as part of a personalized value-added menu of strategies, ensuring the most effective and safe solutions for patients.

- Vitamin D (62.5 mcg [2500 IU] seven days a week).
